## **Crash Synopsis:**

This 1-vehicle reportable crash occurred as Unit 1 was entering the interstate from the entrance ramp. As unit 1 was gaining speed in the right lane a deer ran out directly in front of the car. The operator was unable to swerve and avoid striking the deer. The operator brought the vehicle to a controlled stop on the right shoulder. Unit 1 sustained disabling damage to the front bumper, engine and radiator. Operator of Unit 1 was uninjured.
